## **Installing Linux on USB**

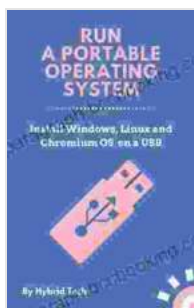
1. Download the Linux ISO file from the website of the Linux distribution you want to install.
