"Jimmy is my brother, and I love him more than words can say. He is a gift in my life, and I am so grateful for the joy he brings me."

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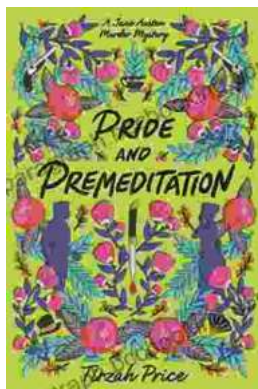
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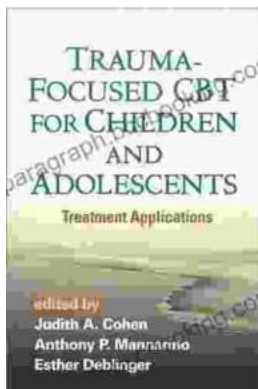
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
